At-Home Support Plan

These strategies are designed to support Sample Learner's growth in a manageable, realistic way at home. The goal is to build confidence, strengthen foundational skills, and reduce frustration through small, consistent practice.

Reading Development (Primary Focus)

Recommended: 10–15 minutes daily

Focus Areas:

- Decoding (sounding out words)
- Sight word recognition
- Confidence with reading

Targeted Activities

1. Lego Letter Building (Phonemic Confidence)
 - Use Lego bricks (or any manipulatives) to build letters and simple words
 - Create 3-letter and eventually 3-syllable words (real or nonsense words)
 - Example: lat, mip, sog → then build into lat-mip

This builds:

- Comfort with sounds
- Flexibility with reading
- Confidence without pressure of “being right.”

2. Sound It Out Practice (5 minutes)
 - Use simple words (cat, dog, sun)
 - Have Sample Learner say each sound, then blend
 - If stuck → model once, then let her try again
3. Sight Word Practice (5 minutes)
 - Practice 5–10 high-frequency words daily (reach out to the teacher for guidance, as different schools have different curricula)
 - Mix known + new words
4. Read Together (5–10 minutes)
 - Take turns reading
 - Step in quickly if frustration begins
 - Keep momentum and confidence high

Targeted Support with ETM

Based on Sample Learner's assessment, targeted support is designed to focus directly on the areas that are currently limiting her confidence and progress, specifically in reading.

What This Support Looks Like

Targeted support is delivered in small group settings (2-4 students) when appropriate, with careful attention to grouping students with similar needs and skill levels.

Each session is intentionally structured to:

- Build foundational reading skills
- Reduce frustration
- Increase confidence and independence

Session length is kept to 30-45 minutes to ensure students remain engaged without becoming overwhelmed. Pushing beyond this point often leads to fatigue and regression, especially at this stage of development.

Recommended Next Step
